Minimizing, Denying or Blaming	
<ul><li>Minimizing abuse</li><li>Blaming survivor for the abuse</li></ul>	<ul> <li>Accusing survivor of "mutual abuse"</li> <li>Denying abuse can occur in same sex relationships or with transgender partner</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>Shoving, pushing</li> <li>Slapping, hitting</li> <li>Kicking</li> <li>Biting</li> <li>Strangulation</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Withholding hormones for gender transition</li> <li>Forced public displays of affection in areas that are not LGBT friendly to intimidate or scare partner</li> <li>Forced public displays of affection that "out" a partner</li> </ul>
Sexual Abuse	
<ul> <li>Physical assaults to "sexual" body areas</li> </ul>	Using gender roles to control what partner does sexually
<ul><li>Forced sex</li><li>Refusal to allow safe sex practices</li></ul>	<ul> <li>Forcing partner to have sex in a way that doesn't align with their gender identity</li> </ul>
Cultural/Identity Abuse	
Using the survivor's culture/identity     against them	Using the survivor's sexual orientation or gender identity against them

<ul> <li>Using children to relay abusive messages</li> </ul>	Threats to or revealing sexual orientation and gender identity to children	
<ul><li>Threatening to take the children</li><li>Threatening to harm the children</li></ul>	<ul> <li>Threats to use sexual orientation or gender identity to gain custody of children</li> </ul>	
Using Isolation		
Limiting the survivor's activities and contact with others	Threatening to or isolating from LGBT networks and social spaces	
Making survivors account for their whereabouts	<ul> <li>Threatening to "out" survivors to estrange them from family or friends</li> </ul>

Controlling finances		
Making survivor ask for money	Threatening to "out" partner to employer	
<ul> <li>Interfering with work or education</li> <li>Using credit cards without permission</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Identity theft which can be easier if the partner is the same sex</li> </ul>
