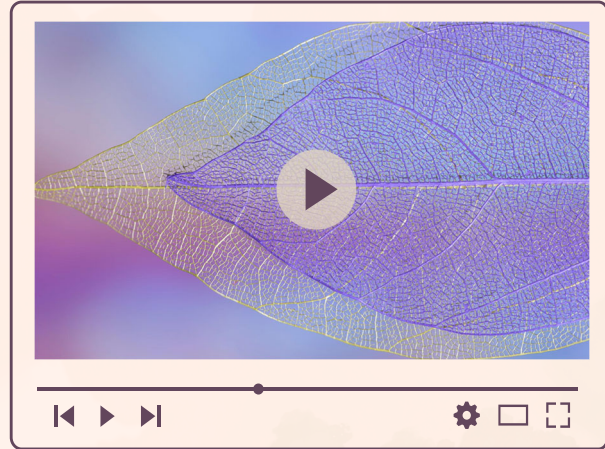

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## Description

On September 22, 2015, Carol Culleton, Anastasia Kuzyk, and Nathalie Warmerdam were murdered in a triple femicide in rural eastern Ontario.

A coroner's inquest examined the circumstances of the deaths and made 86 recommendations for change.

Panelists – all of whom played key roles in the inquest – explore some of the key moments in the proceedings, with a focus on the recommendations and what all of us can do to advocate for their implementation.



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
